Topic: Language Paper 2 - Transactional Writing

Why it's taught: This unit will focus on the reading section of the paper - students will analyse how language is used in non-fiction sources with a focus on how writers use language to convey their views. Comparison skills will be developed further.

Term 1

Topic: Power and Conflict Poetry

Why it's taught: Unseen poetry skills will be revisited and applied to the power and conflict cluster of poems. Students will develop comparison and analytical skills.



Term 1

Topic: Modern Prose / Drama

Why it's taught: Study of J.B. Priestley's 'An Inspector Calls' to build on knowledge of social responsibility and authorial intention from Y10, considering how language is used and how a text is influenced by context.



Term 3

Topic: Language Paper 2 - Transactional Writing (Spoken language endorsement)

Why it's taught: This is the only non-examined aspect of the course. Students will develop persuasive writing skills and understanding of rhetoric and use this knowledge to draft, edit and then deliver a persuasive speech. This is a compulsive element of the course.

Topic: Macbeth (Continued)

Why it's taught: (See previous)



Term 2

Topic: Macbeth

Why it's taught: Study of plot, character and themes of Shakespeare's Macbeth building on aspects of tragedy taught in KS3. To ensure in depth consideration of how language is used and exam techniques can be taught effectively, this will be taught across two half terms.



Term 2

Topic: Unseen Poetry

Why it's taught: Exploration of unseen poems - developing understanding of how themes from ACC such as family and relationships can be shown through poetry. Revision of poetic devices and development of analysis.



Term 1

Topic: 19th Century Novel

Why it's taught: In depth study of Dickens' 'A Christmas Carol', building on knowledge of 19th Century Literature from KS3. Exploring character, themes and context with exam skills built into the scheme.

Topic: Language Paper 1

Why it's taught: Introduction to Language Paper 1.

Reading skills - analysing language and structure in fiction extracts

Creative writing skills - introduction to our four part structure.
